Central Idaho Whitebark Pine: High, Dry and Burned

Come learn, discuss and see examples of impacts by wildfires and mountain pine beetle and what managers are doing about them in Stanley, Idaho. Thursday (9/20) will be an exciting day of presentations on current and developing research and management at the Stanley Community Center (seating limited to 100 people). Followed by a fun-filled evening of networking and silent auction at the newly remodeled Mountain Village Bar/Restaurant. Friday (9/21) is a field trip to Cache Creek Restoration Project on the Boise National Forest where the 2016 Rough and Pioneer Fires burned within weeks with widely different impacts. Saturday (9/22) is a field trip to the 2012 Halstead fire on Salmon-Challis National Forest to discuss options for management in severely burned areas with little natural seeding and to foster a restoration partnership.
