Central Idaho Whitebark Pine: High, Dry and Burned

Come discuss and see examples of the threats to whitebark pine and what managers are doing about them in beautiful Stanley, Idaho. Thursday will be a fun-filled day with presentations from invited scientists on current and developing research and management of whitebark pine at the Stanley Community Center (seating limited to 100 people, 8 am to 5 pm). Followed by a fun-filled evening of networking and silent auction at the newly remodeled Mountain Village's Velvet Falls Dance Hall. Friday is an all-day field trip to Galena Summit and Rainbow Creek Project on the SNRA to discuss recent beetle kill, white pine blister rust, planting and thinning treatments. Saturday is a morning field trip to discuss growing a partnership to address keeping sustainable populations of whitebark pine on the landscape in the face of severe wildfire and little seed for planting.
